



## The Weather Room

The waterfront pavilion uses water as a design element to create a sensory experience and deepen conversations about weather in Northern Ireland's urban spaces.

A collection of sculptural instruments such as rain and tidal gauges encourage public engagement in observing and discussing climate impacts. The roof, composed of surfaces angled at varying degrees, manipulates the rate that water flows into a collection pool, highlighting how architecture can control the elements.

By integrating weather phenomena into the built environment, the pavilion becomes a destination for reflection and interaction, encouraging awareness of environmental change and the role of design.
